Sending Emails

- Send from a professional address
- Clear, relevant Subject line
 - Short phrase e.g. “IELTS Refund”
 - Not just “Question” or “Problem”
- Type your message in the body
 - Not the Subject line
- Be clear, concise and polite
 - But write like a letter, not an instant message
- Use CC to add other people who need to know
- Make sure to sign off with your name!

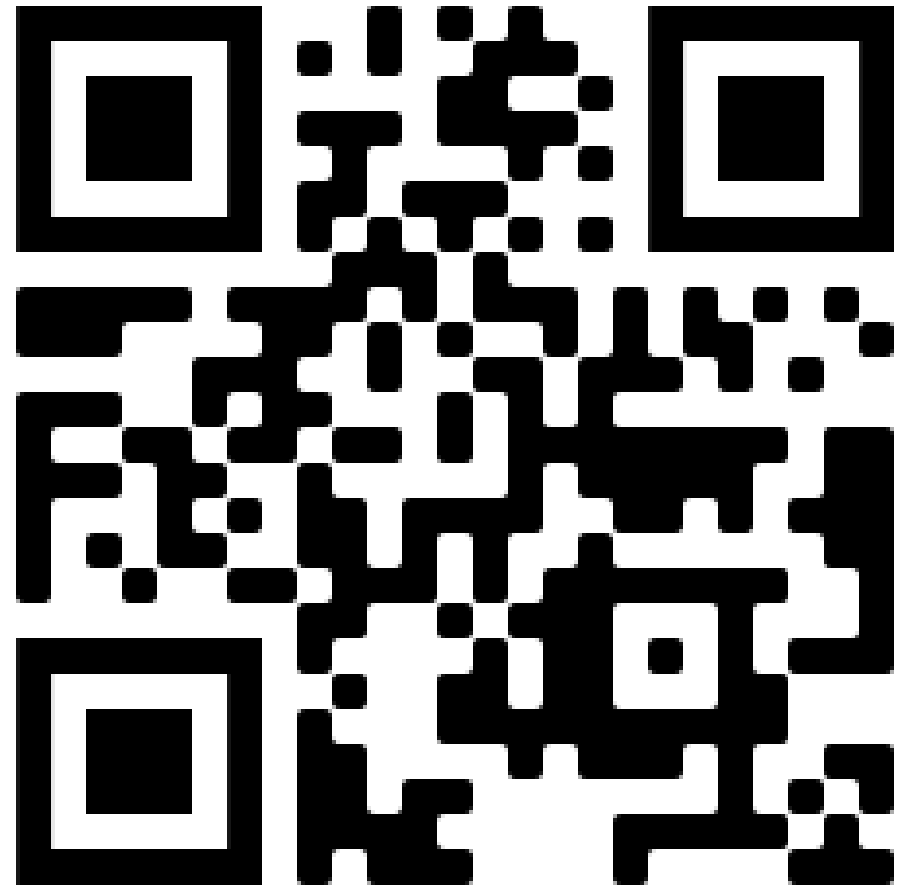
- You will have an EF UP email account

 - FirstInitials.Surname@efupox.co.uk
 - e.g. fi.surname@efupox.co.uk
- Initials are for anything written on your EF ID as a new word, with a hyphen, or as a capital letter mid-word
- Temporary password: Oxf!2022
 - Please change this to something unique and memorable
- Check it regularly or set up forwarding to an email you will check

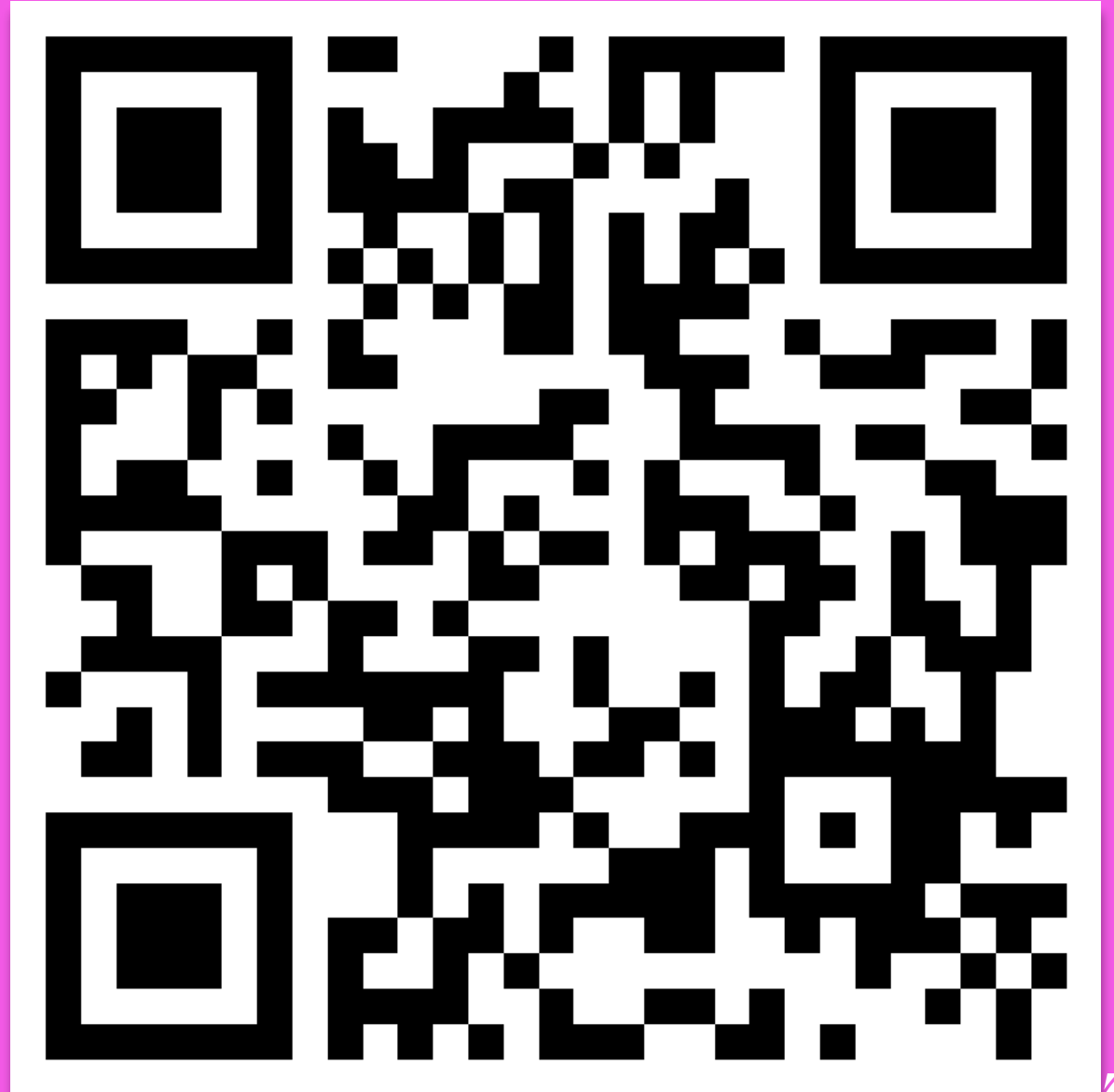
